# The 37th Annual Cumberland Fair Pumpkin and Squash Weigh-Off

Cumberland County Fair is now a registered member in the GIANT PUMPKIN COMMONWEALTH.

## Weigh-off

1. All judges' decisions are final. All judges will be responsible to have a complete knowledge of all rules and how to implement them fairly. It will be necessary to have a current copy of the rules present at each site in public view so anyone may reference them.
2. Growers are to aid and assist the site in running the weigh-off upholding the integrity of the weigh-off site.
3. The Cumberland Farmers Club representative and site coordinator are to be in charge of the gathering of registration, money, weights, measurements, and other information deemed necessary.
4. Site coordinators, growers, and the Cumberland Farmers Club representatives, and site representatives are to work as a team to ensure each site is as accommodating to the growers, site, and Cumberland Farmers Club as possible, upholding the values of fair competition.
5. The Cumberland Farmers Club Giant Pumpkin/Squash weigh-offs are open to anyone wishing to participate without prejudice. All growers must comply with all rules and regulations set forth at the weigh-off site they wish to participate in. Any rules the Cumberland Farmers Club wishes to have must be fair and impartial for all growers.
6. The above-mentioned representatives will also assume responsibility of ensuring the integrity of the fruits and that scales have been calibrated by a recognized weights and measurement business or government prior to the weigh-off.

## Fruits and Growers

1. The entry must be grown, cared for from seed to harvest, and exhibited by the grower. In case of an emergency the site coordinator, grower representative, and site representative will make a decision on the validity of the excuse.
2. Number of entries shall be limited to the following in the name of fairness: Giant Pumpkins – Adult: One entry per family. Giant Squash – Adult: One entry per family. Giant Pumpkins – Child (ages 8-15): One entry per child; limit 3 children per family. Giant Squash – Child (ages 8-15): One entry per child; limit 3 children per family. Jack-O-Lanterns – Adult: One entry per family. Jack-O-Lanterns – Child (under 15): One entry per child; limit 3 children per family.
3. Judges for a weigh-off will consist of the club/grower representative, site coordinator, and site representative, or 2 experienced growers. The two judges for the growers will be appointed by the Cumberland Farmers Club representatives. If any judge has an entry that is in question or cannot be present the day of the weigh-off, they will be excused from the judge's panel and another grower will be appointed in their place.
4. All specimens must be weighed on a certified scale. A certified scale is one that has been inspected and certified by a Federal Governmental Agency and must have a current certification sticker attached to the scale. Scales that have been certified by a local government agency for commercial purposes are also acceptable scales.
5. No foreign material (i.e. fungicides, caulking, skin additives, etc.) will be permitted in the weighing of any fruit. Vines must be trimmed to within one inch of the stem of the fruit. The judges have the right to inspect any and all fruit before weights and measurements become official. Refusal of any inspection to any entry will cause the entry to be classified "exhibition" only.
6. The specimen must be sound, healthy, and undamaged. Entries must be free of rot, holes or cracks through to the cavity and serious soft spots.
  - A. If a soft spot is superficial and does not go through to the cavity of the fruit, it will be judged as an official entry.
  - B. The judges reserve the right to prove cracks, holes, and to dig out soft spots to judge a fruit official or not. Before the judges can execute any of the previous, they must have the grower present.
7. All entries, except field pumpkins (Jack-O-Lanterns), must arrive on a pallet for ease of handling by Cumberland Fair personnel.
8. Giant pumpkin/squash must weigh at least 100 pounds to enter.
9. All entries must stay on the fairgrounds for the entire duration of the Fair.
10. Fruit will be accepted at designated gate on Bruce Hill Road at Hall Road, the access to the Fair and Farm Museum, only from 8:30 a.m. to 9:30 a.m. on Sunday, September 21.
11. Fruit will be weighed beginning at 9:30 a.m. Sunday, September 21.
12. Field pumpkins (Jack-O-Lanterns) may be moved to inside the Exhibition Hall after weigh-off.

## Color Requirements and Prize Money

1. A. Squash will be classified as follows – 100% of the following colors or color combinations: green, blue and gray. The surface area of the fruit as grown in the garden, not including the portion that was in contact with, or close proximity to the ground. This area will include the area between the ribs, around the stem, and the blossom end. This will not include any netting (cantaloping) or any discoloration caused by the close proximity to, or the area on the ground.
  - B. Pumpkins will be all fruit not classified as squash.
2. In the event of a tie of two or more places, all entries that are tied will have the prize money for the places that are tied, added together then split equally amongst the places that are involved.
3. Winner will be the heaviest pumpkin or squash by weight.
4. All fruit entered shall be grown within the borders of the State of Maine to be eligible for premiums. The Cumberland Farmers Club and its officially sanctioned site shall not be held liable for compensation, loss, damage, or injury to any person, exhibit, or personal property. All premiums are not guaranteed. Money payouts will be contingent upon receipt of sponsorship amounts received.

## GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. Only ONE entry in each class/contest by an exhibitor will be accepted, including "All Other" categories, unless otherwise specified.
2. No article may be exhibited a second time.
3. Articles must have been finished, grown or raised the same year they are exhibited.
4. Articles must be made by the person under whose name they are exhibited.
5. ALL ARTICLES MUST BE CLEAN AND FREE OF ODORS, HAIRS, STAINS, ETC., OR ITEM WILL BE DISQUALIFIED.
6. All items, except fruits and vegetables, contests, and group displays are judged on their own merit. They are not judged against other items in the category.

7. When there is only one entry in a listed contest, it will be given the premium considered worthy by the judges.

8. Exhibits by people with disabilities invited. Please specify as such on the entry blank.

9. Hall Superintendent may refuse items, or judges may disqualify items, not acceptable for exhibit or that do not comply with the rules and regulations.

10. Care will be taken to prevent loss or damage, but the CUMBERLAND FARMERS CLUB WILL NOT BE RESPONSIBLE FOR ANY INJURY OR LOSS.

11. Adults are considered as individuals ages 16 and up. Youth are considered as individuals ages 15 and under. Youth may enter any category unless specifically listed as an adult category.

12. Exhibits which include a candle will not be accepted.

13. Additional rules may be listed under specific classes.

4.103 Maine Wild Blueberry Contest – Blueberry Biscuits

(Adult, 16 & over)

### Blueberry Biscuits

INGREDIENTS:

1 tablespoon unsalted butter, melted, plus 10 tablespoons unsalted butter, cut into 1/2-inch pieces and chilled

3 cups (15 ounces) all-purpose flour

1/2 cup (3 1/2 ounces) sugar

2 teaspoons baking powder

1/2 teaspoon baking soda

1 1/4 teaspoons table salt

7 1/2 ounces (1 1/2 cups) blueberries

1 2/3 cups buttermilk, chilled

DIRECTIONS:

1. Adjust oven rack to middle position and heat oven to 425 degrees. Brush bottom and sides of 8-inch square baking pan with melted butter.
2. Whisk flour, sugar, baking powder, baking soda, and salt together in large bowl. Add chilled butter to flour mixture and smash butter between your fingertips into flat, irregular pieces. Add blueberries and toss with flour mixture. Gently stir in buttermilk until no dry pockets of flour remain.
3. Using rubber spatula, transfer dough to prepared pan and spread into even layer and into corners of pan. Using bench scraper sprayed with vegetable oil spray, cut dough into 9 equal squares (2 cuts by 2 cuts), but do not separate. Bake until browned on top and paring knife inserted into center biscuit comes out clean, 40 to 45 minutes.

14.104 Blueberry Cake - Youth (15 & under)

### Blueberry Cake

INGREDIENTS:

1/2 cup shortening

1 cup sugar

2 eggs

1 cup milk

2 cups sifted all-purpose flour

4 teaspoons baking powder

1 teaspoon nutmeg

2 cups wild Maine blueberries

DIRECTIONS:

1. Preheat oven to 375 degrees F (165 degrees C).
2. Cream the shortening; add the sugar and beat until creamy. Add the eggs, one at a time, and beat until light and foamy.
3. Mix together and sift the flour, baking powder, salt and nutmeg, and add alternately to the creamed mixture with the milk.
4. Fold in the blueberries.
5. Pour batter into 2 well-greased 9" or 10" layer cake pans.
6. Bake for 25-30 minutes.
7. Remove from the oven and let cool in pan for 10 minutes, then turn out onto a cake rack.

3 cups flour

2 1/2 tsp Bakewell Cream

1 1/2 tsp baking soda

1 tsp salt

2 cups scalded milk

1 egg beaten

3/4 cup sugar or honey

DIRECTIONS:

1. Pour scalded milk over grapenuts and let stand until cool.
2. Add beaten egg, sugar and then mixed dry ingredients.
3. Pour into greased loaf pan. Let stand for 20 minutes and bake at 350 degrees for 1 1/2 hours. Makes 1 loaf

14.202 Bakewell Cream Peanut Butter Cookies - Youth (15 & under)

1 1/4 cups flour

1/2 tsp Bakewell Cream

1/2 cup sugar

3/4 tsp baking soda

1/2 cup brown sugar

1/4 tsp salt

1/2 cup soft margarine

1/2 cup peanut butter

1 egg

**DIRECTIONS:**

1. Mix thoroughly margarine, peanut butter, sugar, brown sugar, and egg.
2. Add combined dry ingredients and stir in.
3. Chill dough.
4. Roll into balls the size of a walnut.
5. Place 3 inches apart on a lightly greased cookie sheet. Flatten out with a fork dipped in flour crisscross.
6. Bake until set, but not hard! 375 10-12 minutes

**KING ARTHUR BANANA BREAD****INGREDIENTS:**

- 2 large eggs
- 1 cup sugar
- 1/3 cup vegetable oil
- 1 cup banana, mashed (2 to 3 very ripe)
- 2 teaspoons vanilla extract
- 1 teaspoon baking soda
- 1 teaspoon baking powder
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1 teaspoon cinnamon
- 1/2 teaspoon nutmeg
- 2 2/3 cups flour
- 1 cup buttermilk or 1 cup sour cream
- 1 cup walnuts, chopped

**DIRECTIONS:**

1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees F.
2. In a medium-sized bowl, beat together eggs, sugar, and oil. Blend in the mashed banana and vanilla.
3. Whisk together and then sift the baking soda, baking powder, salt, cinnamon, nutmeg and flour. Add all at once to banana mixture. Mix quickly but thoroughly, then stir in the yogurt (I used sour cream) and nuts, mixing until just combined.
4. Pour the batter into a greased loaf pan. Bake the bread for about 1 hour, until a cake tester inserted in the center comes out clean. If the bread begins to brown too quickly, tent it with aluminum foil after 40 minutes in the oven.
5. When the bread tests done, remove it from the oven and place it on rack for 15 minutes; after that, remove it from pan and place it on rack to finish cooling completely.
